

PHELPS VETS CLUB

Many of you know by now of the passing of a dear friend and valuable volunteer in our community -Robert Welch, on Christmas Day 2022. We'd like to take this opportunity to acknowledge some of the many contributions he has made. He has been there for lots of us, tirelessly and selflessly for many years, engaging in the Cadets Program for our youth, spearheading pop can drives to help with funding. Over the years he's volunteered with various Rec Center programs and during the last 10+ years he has been instrumental in helping the Vets Club in tending bar and helping with Club maintenance, fixing things as needed. It seems as if he has always been there for us, ready and willing to help however he can. We all miss his smiling face and everything he did for us very much.

The summer is upon us, and as such, our Club will close down as of the end of June for regular openings for the summer, reopening after Labour Day - including our regular euchre, cribbage and darts nights.

Your Board has been focusing on Accessibility for All in the Club. The Vets Club is one of the main Emergency Response Centers which means that in the event of an actual declared emergency (such as severe flooding, fire, chemical spills, etc.), if residents were required to evacuate, this is one of the locations one would head to (if it was deemed safe). As such, the building needs to be accessible for all, including those with physical limitations. We have 3 key projects we are undertaking under this 'Assessibility for All' umbrella.

The first project is 'Ramp Up Redbridge' - building an external ramp for access to the upstairs hall. We hope to be able to build this ramp this fall, depending on material, funds and volunteer availability. Then in the winter we plan on renovating one washroom on each floor for accessibility.

The Vets Club has no regular revenue stream from the government, including our local tax levy. The Club relies solely on Membership dues and any fundraising activities we embark on, to not only keep the lights and heat on, offer some great events and services for our residents, but also do some much needed building renovations.

We will be launching a broad communication initiative over the next few months to raise awareness and seek support from our community members.

For the 'Ramp Up Redbridge' project, we will be asking for monetary and material donations from businesses (including North Bay building centres) and individuals, and we will need volunteers to help with all aspects of the build. Detailed planning is currently underway to develop a full Materials List and identify volunteers for skilled and general labour, meal prep to keep tummies happy, etc.

As we are trying to keep costs to a minimum, we are really in need of logs for posts and (rough) lumber, and access to a couple of local sawmills (bandsaw).

All help will be appreciated. Stay tuned for more information as we finish detailed planning and firm up requirements and dates (before frost). We would like to thank both the Firehall and the Rec Center for helping us with this huge initiative! From the Easter Egg Hunt event at the Rec, the Firehall kindly donated part of the proceeds to the Club.

AND - the Firehall is organizing a Softball Tournament on July 15 at the Rec ball diamond with proceeds going to these Accessibility Projects for the Vets Club. The Vets will be operating an outdoor Beer Garden at this event! We are really looking forward to this really fun packed day and hope to see many of you out! We are very appreciative of living in such a giving community. Volunteers make the world go round - and so does our local community organizations working together to help each other! Thank you!

PHELPS VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

Happy Summer Everyone. As I'm sure you know, the fire department has been pretty busy lately. We've been working hard at training, whether it be at the hall Wednesday nights, weekend training for our Emergency Medical Responder course that was taken between April and May, or attending information meetings and conferences. We're happy to say that we will be hosting 2 different courses at our department this year for our members and other NFPP departments. These courses will definitely be an asset not only to our department but to our community. We have also received a Fire Hazard Rating sign from the MNRF that we will be putting up this summer to better inform the community of what the ratings are. This past March, myself and our Deputy Chief were fortunate enough to attend the Northeastern Fire

Fire Education Conference and Trade Show in Huntsville, where we were able to purchase a Thermal Imaging Camera to be used during fire calls. We feel this will help our department in finding hotspots, reducing the amount of return calls.

We have a few events coming up this summer. June 24th we will be at the Rec Center's farmers market and breakfast!!! Not onlywill we be serving your breakfast, but we will have our fire truck at the market and will be joined by Sparky the Fire Dog!!! All proceeds from the breakfast will be going to the Fire Department to go towards training gear and equipment for the team.

Also, if you haven't seen it on the board at the Redbridge Store, the Fire Department alongside the Rec Centre and the Vet's Club will be hosting a softball tournament on July 15th to help raise money for the Vet's Club. This summer, we would like to remind everyone about BBQ Safety.

- All barbeque grills must only be used outdoors
- Using grills indoors or in enclosed spaces is not only a fire hazard, but it exposes occupants to toxic gasses and potential asphyxiation.
- Always position the grill well away from combustible objects buildings, fences, deck railings and landscaping can easily and quickly ignite.
- Get your grill cleaned and serviced. Check all propane tanks and lines for leaks and damage.
- Never leave a lit grill unattended.
- Always use long handled grilling utensils and heat resistant oven mitts to avoid exposure burns from heat and flames.
- Periodically remove grease build-up in catch trays to prevent it from igniting.
- Keep a garden hose nearby, connected and ready for use in case of a fire.

If anyone is interested in helping at the Fire Department, we meet Wednesday nights at 7 p.m., and always welcome people to stop by.

"Yes, the works."


"What about vitamins, sleeping pills, Geritol, antacids?"

PHELPS PUBLIC LIBRARY

Hello to all the readers out there, especially those of you who use these facilities for finding good reading materials, including DVDs and magazines. Remember Wellington and Belvedere are waiting for young children in our basement area. There's a lot of wonderful books and toys such as lego to play with and lots of places to sit while you check them out.

I've been starting the library Buzzer articles with excerpts from the Tweedsmuir History volumes and thought this time you might like to hear what sports was like back in the day. There were sports events even back when Redbridge got started - groups of people entertaining themselves on weekends or holidays. Some of these events were talked about and we have newspaper clippings to prove it. One example: 1964 - Two teams, Phelps Flying Mothers and Phelps Single Girls played ball against each other at the field here. Approximately 200 spectators attended this particular game. The Mothers were defeated 4 - 2.

Example 2: Phelps Peewees enter the South River Lions Club tournament. There were seven or eight teams involved (March 14/64).

Then in 1965, the Phelps Athletic Association became part of the Phelps Recreation Council. They had fund raising events and besides more money, had more volunteers. Approval was given to enter teams (many age levels) in many other league's events. We heard that the Peewees went to a tournament in New Liskeard and did quite well.

In September of 1965, the Phelps Athletics baseball team upset favourites in the Nipissing Fast Ball League edging the win from KVC Electrics 4 - 3 playing at Phelps field. Dan Reed was the winning pitcher. From this time on the Phelps Recreation Council ensured there was nearly always baseball and other activity at the field and other parts of the park area.

3. Shiver - Lisa Jackson



- 4. The Girl in the Picture Kerry Barret Involves two women, one house, centuries of secrets. The house has a reputation for brutal murders many years ago. What do they have to face while they attempt to find out what happened? Not a bed time story!
- 5. The Murder House James Patterson You would want this house at first sight with its ocean front view and a private beach "<u>but</u>" it has a deadly secret that won't stay buried. It was the scene of unsolved killings and is rumoured to be cursed. Jenna, a former New York City cop, risks her life to find the truth.

The last three are for those who like grim stories full of suspense and we have many more but also come and look for all other kinds that are touching, educational, about other countries and nationalities. Many about lives that sound a little like our own or someone we know. There are also many different topics downstairs in the children's area. I think you'll be pleased with the illustrations and quality of the books you'll find on those shelves.
