## PHELPS PUBLIC LIBRARY

It's hard to believe that Autumn "September 21" is nearly here and will be when you find this in your mailbox. Think of the beautiful leaves as they fall and stock up on books, DVD's and magazines from the library since, all too soon, you will be "enjoying" that other season.

I've been starting the Buzzer articles with histories of local families according to the Tweedsmuir History which was put together by Joan and Fran Morris. This article was sent in by Mrs. Marie Johnston.

"John Johnston and Marie were married in 1930 at Brooklin, Ontario. Tamsworth was their village and daughter Fran was born there in 1931

During the depression the owner of 5 ½ Lot 15, Conc.4 of Phelps Township came to visit. He wanted to live in southern Ontario. He and the Johnstons made a trade. That was in May 1933. They now owned a farm of 123 acres. A pile of lumber on the property became the start of a new home on Highway 63. With help from a midwife, Robert was born there and Alice was born in 1940 in Toronto. Then Donald was born in North Bay in 1947."

Their family has been active in the community since the beginning with similar trials and tribulations as we all experience. Don and his family still live here on Hwy 63 and are still extremely beneficial to our community. We are lucky they settled here!

We still have Hummels in the community. They came in July 1928. We'll put some info in the next article re that amazing family.

The history of the library itself can be found in a blue binder on a large desk at the library. You can look at it there but it can't be taken out. There are memory sticks that can be purchased at \$40.00 from Fran Morris. You can also sit at a computer at the library and check out the Tweedsmuir History. The volunteers should be able to help if you need it.

If you are visiting for books, etc., there is one complete shelf - front to back - of DVDs. People are surprised at the number and quality we have. Right at the front, we have a magazine unit with a hugh variety of titles including sports, gardening, crafts, camping, etc. Downstairs is an extremely large collection of childrens books plus other interesting things, like Belvedere and Wellington, who would love to be read to.

Some books adults might enjoy:

An Unexpected Grace - Kristin von Kreisler

A heartwarming story about the healing power of dogs - the friendship of one woman and a dog.

Lost and Found - Carolyn Parkhurst

Entertaining and unexpectingly wise story - the author catches things about a mother and daughter that no camera could.

Darkness the Color of Snow - Thomas Colt

On a freezing night on a rural highway, Patrolman Ronny Forbet sits in his cruiser trying to keep warm. Then a car speeds over the hill, forcing Ronny to chase it. It should have been an ordinary drunk driving case <u>but</u> ends up an unbelievably complicated struggle - a portrait of decency and desperation - ambition and heated passion.

Rage - Bob Woodward

This author is drawing from hundreds of hours of interviews, emails, diaries, confidential documents and never seen personal letters and discussions facing global pandemics, economic disasters, racial unrest and other serious problems facing the country U.S.A. because of the politics of Donald Trump. 

We had a great turnout for our first annual fundraiser softball tournament with the proceeds of the registration and beer garden going to the Vet's Club. This year we were able to raise just over \$2.800 to go towards their accessibility project and the Rec Center raised over \$400 from their bbq to go towards their upcoming projects!!!
