

Hello Redbridge Readers:

Are you ready for the next saga of pioneering in Redbridge? I chose this one family because some of the descendants still live here which makes it very interesting to hear when and how it began back on September 7, 1925.

Four men, including Ralph Reaume, pitched their tents by the North River. They cut and hauled logs from the bush by hand - no horses! When one log cabin was built, they all lived in it until the next one was built. In the spring, Mr Reaume began to cut and peel logs for his own home. Mr. Funk came with horses to help get everything in position using moss to chink between the logs. All the furniture was made by Mr. Reaume. There was no bridge over the North River so all goods from stores had to be carried across a log felled for that purpose. That was the beginning (not easy!)

Next time I'll have to tell you about the Phelps Athletic Association formed in 1947 that created a huge beneficial impact on our area.

PHELPS VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT

Spring is almost here and the weather seems to be getting nicer and nicer out. With this in mind, we would like to remind everyone that as of April 1st there is no daytime burning permitted until October 31st. If you wish to burn, there are a couple of things to remember:

- Burning is to be done between 7 pm and 7
- The pile cannot be any bigger that 2m x 2m x 2m (6ft x 6ft x 6ft)
- Burn only 1 pile at a time
- Keep the pile at least 2m (6ft) from any flammable materials
- Have tools or water on hand to contain the fire at the site
- Make sure a responsible person attends the fire **AT ALL TIMES**

Winter took its time arriving this year, however it did finally settle in by mid January delivering several messy snow storms and a couple of freezing rain events. The MTO and equipment operators did a great job keeping the roads drivable before and after each storm event. As the winter control season comes to an end and the warm weather moves in, we are expecting a particularly bad frost heave and pothole season, due to the many freeze and thaw cycles throughout the mild winter.

The Board will be meeting with the MTO on April 28th to discuss the funding available for 2023 and identifying the work to be completed within the limited budget. There is some carry over work from 2022 to complete, there is more gravel to spread on Songis Road which will continue this summer, along with some brushing. After the budget has been finalized, we will be posting the details on the Redbridge website.

A reminder to anyone with construction plans or requiring heavy truck delivery this spring, half load season lasts until the end of May or early June, please wait until the posted signs come down, fines will be issued for violations.

We would also like to take this time to wish everyone a Happy Easter.

We will be brainstorming the details at our upcoming Board meeting at the beginning of April. Stay tuned for some community outreach information coming in April. Please consider helping however you can, as this is the only large hall facility in our community as well as our official designated Emergency Management site!

As far as events, we continue to enjoy the True Country Boys matinee on the last Sunday of each month, with so many thanks to Ervil Boreland! We hope to resume some Saturday music nights with a mix of rock, blues, and folk music from some great local talent this spring - stay tuned.

We are so happy that Snowshoe Golf was able to resume this year! It was a good turnout and mild weather, and of course we all had full bellies thanks to Judy Wardell and several other volunteers cooking up a storm!
